Universidad Carlos III de Madrid (UC3M) is a **public university**, innovative and committed to improving society through cutting-edge research and high quality teaching, in accordance with the most stringent international guidelines. It has three undergraduate centers, a School of Postgraduate Studies, and a Doctoral School. It offers **42 Bachelor's Degrees** of which **27 are bilingual or taught entirely in English** (67% of the degrees offered). It also offers **112 Master Programs** and **19 PhD Programs**. Created in 1989, it develops its activities in four campuses and has **18,000 students**, of which **20% are international students**. In addition, it is the first university in Spain and the third in Europe with the largest number of students participating in Erasmus programs; overall, **42% of the students** who graduate every year have participated in international mobility programs.

UC3M is included in the **QS ranking** of the 50 best universities in the world with less than 50 years. Our engineering programs have the EUR-ACE label. We are the first public university to obtain the AACSB accreditation.
