About University:

The University of the Free State (UFS) is one of the oldest institutions of higher education in South Africa. It opened its doors in 1904 on the Bloemfontein Campus with a mere six students in the Humanities faculty. Since then, the institution has grown to more than 33000 students, spread across seven faculties: Education, Economic and Management Sciences, Health Sciences, Humanities, Law, Natural and Agricultural Sciences, Theology.

The UFS boasts three campuses in the Free State – one of the nine provinces of South Africa. The university has been established in Bloemfontein, and was expanded with the addition of the Qwaqwa Campus (in the Eastern Free State) in 2003, and the South Campus – in Bloemfontein – in 2004. The South Campus provides alternative access to higher education for promising students who have not obtained the required marks in their final school examinations. Our vibrant Qwaqwa Campus serves a rapidly-growing number of rural students from the immediate area and surrounding provinces.

Accommodation on campus is limited and must be reserved well in advance. Rooms in residences are furnished with a bed, desk, chair, curtains and linen. All residences have access control. The cost of accommodation in a campus residence for undergraduate students varies between R2 000 and R3 620 per month (excluding meals).
