Credits and grading	Each student will carry a normal study load per semester. Credits obtained will depend on the number of modules prescribed for a specific degree programme.	
Grading of credits	A grade point average (GPA) is a number (%) that represents the average of a student's grades during a study period. It is weighted by the number of credits allocated to the modules the student was enrolled for. From 2012 onwards only a GPA based on module credits will be used to calculate a student's average.

Study visa	As soon as they have been admitted, students must apply for study visas at the South African High Commission in their home countries or nearest neighbouring country.	
Compulsory medical cover	All non-South African citizens need to comply with the immigration regulation as determined by the Republic before registration.  Medical cover is required at all times for the period of your visa validity.
